Change in State Per Capita Dues

A survey of all Ohio Law Enforcement contracts has revealed that the average law enforcement officer's salary went up by 3.23% in the last year. Per the Constitution of FOP of Ohio, the annual per capita will now be \$18.04 per member, per year. This is a raise from \$17.66 per member, per year. The State Lodge thanks all of you for your support and continued membership.

FOP Chases Teamsters Out of Nashville

The Officers of Metro Nashville Police Department voted overwhelmingly to remove the International Brotherhood of Teamsters as the exclusive bargaining agent. The members voted 671 to decertify the Teamsters. Only 122 officers voted to retain the Teamsters as their representative. Danny Hale, President of the Fraternal Order of Police Andrew Jackson Lodge #5 stated, "The vote today is proof that law enforcement officers will no longer be misled by the lies of the Teamsters. The Fraternal Order of Police is the only organization to represent law enforcement officers. The officers of the MNPD are united and ready to put this sad chapter behind us. We need to move forward. FOP Lodge 5 is ready to meet with the city to address the many issues facing MNPD officers." At least two former police officers have been criminally charged in Tennessee for planting surveillance cameras at the Nashville FOP's summer camp they have for underprivileged children. How sad that the Teamsters would stoop so low to keep a unit!!!

Grand Lodge Asks Vendors to Use American and Union Made Products
